Making the transition to Sixth Form

The transition from Year 11 to Sixth Form is extremely important. It is a fundamental aspect of the development of successful, independent and enthusiastic learners. Both the happiness of our students and their academic progress are of paramount importance to us, which is why we pay particular attention to how students settle into Bishop Ullathorne in Year 12.

Some key features of our Year 12 transition programme are as follows:

The first weeks of Year 12

There is an initial transition period during the first three weeks in September during which students are assessed and subject teachers report on their suitability for their chosen courses.

Sixth Form Information Evening

In September, all Year 12 students and their parents are invited to an information evening. They are also provided with key information about Sixth Form life and how parents can support their child to meet their full potential during their A Level studies.

Continual support at all levels

All students receive a one-to-one meeting during the first weeks of Year 12 with a member of our Sixth Form team. Students have a dedicated Form Tutor who they see daily and follow a Tutor Time programme of activities, including learning about the A Level Mindset VESPA programme. Students have timetabled and supervised independent study lessons so that they make the most of their non-contact time. Our excellent student liaison officers monitor transition closely to ensure that all students are settling in and fully accessing the opportunities on offer.

Recognising our Gifts

Success at A Level depends on habits, routines, attitudes and approaches to study. It is behaviours, not intelligence, that determine results.

Here at Bishop Ullathorne, we are leading the way with the ground-breaking A Level Mindset programme that is known as the VESPA model. Students learn all about this in Tutor Time and it is reinforced in lessons.

VESPA (which stands for Vision, Effort, Systems, Practice and Attitude) is a mindset that will help improve success. Students who are successful:

- Know what they want to achieve (VISION)
- Complete many hours of independent study (EFFORT)
- Organise their learning resources and their time (SYSTEMS)
- Practise and develop their skills (PRACTICE)
- Respond constructively to challenge (ATTITUDE)

Successful studying in Years 12 and 13 is not just dependent on the development of skills but also attitudes and approaches that will enable to overcome the inevitable challenges.

Enrichment programme
