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
Message from our Headteacher

Additionally, our weekly inter-form competitions have continued apace for the best attending form and the form that has achieved the highest number of Ace points. The raffle will be drawn for both categories when we come back in January. The results for this half term are above.

Year 7 Character passport

During this second half term, the students have been working hard to complete the Bronze Award of the Character Passport. This was launched by Miss Hully in October. This involves students meeting certain criteria to show that they have contributed in some way to the wider

school community and that they are enriching their own school experience. To do this they also need to show that they have gained the required number of Ace points and have attended school regularly, meeting the average Year 7 attendance of 97% as well as having met certain criteria of their choosing and Super Curriculum requirements. A huge congratulations goes to over two-thirds of the year group currently, who have already attained Bronze and have received their badges and certificates.

If anyone has not quite met all the requirements at this stage, they can still embark on their Silver award next term whilst working on the any missing area(s) for the Bronze level. Then, as long as they meet all the Bronze level requirements by the end of next term, then they can potentially achieve both the Bronze and Silver Awards together at this point. If anyone has not started on the Character Passport at all yet and would now like to do so, they can also start the Bronze Award in the Spring term.



Clubs and activities

The Autumn term has seen our busy clubs and activities programme go live, with activities to suit all interests. This is what some of our students have said about just a few of the clubs we offer:

Houses of Parliament

In November, Mrs Penson and Mr Griffiths took a group of Sixth Formers and Year 10s to visit the Houses of Parliament on a Parliamentary Tour, conducted by a very knowledgeable and interesting guide. They started at Westminster Hall where the Queen lay in state before her funeral, and also the place where Charles I was tried and sentenced to death. From there they entered the House of Commons Chamber, where the first MPs met to debate, and then went onto the House of Lords Chamber. Once the tour was finished they left the Houses of Parliament and did a self guided tour of the main landmark buildings in London. These included Number 10 Downing Street, Nelson's Column, Buckingham Palace and Westminster Abbey.

Everyone had a very enjoyable day and our students were great ambassadors of our school.





Biology

At the start of November, our Year 12 Biology students visited the School of Life Sciences at the University of Warwick.

The visit was to support and extend their Biology curriculum and consisted of an electron microscope session where students used an expensive electron microscope to look at cell components and bacteriophages. In another session, they used the confocal microscopy facility to see how luminescence allows us to see our cells at work. In the third activity students looked at microscopic slides under the light microscope. They looked at sections of oesophagus, intestine, stomach, liver, kidney and skin.



Chemistry

Our Year 12 and 13 Chemistry students were invited to meet Dr Peter Hoare, STEM Outreach Officer from Newcastle University.

As part of his "Spectroscopy in a Suitcase" lecture, Dr Hoare brought portable desk-top machines to measure infrared spectra and talked the students through spectral analysis. Students were able to handle and see specialised equipment not available to schools or Sixth Forms. They also interpreted real chemical IR spectra as a way of analysing the functional groups present in different organic compounds.



Dr Hoare is also an AQA examination officer and was able to give invaluable advice on examination techniques linked to these chemical analysis topics.

Student comments included:

"It was fun trying to work out functional groups of different molecules and being able to smell them and know their uses."

"As a Year 13 student, it was nice to see content we learnt in Year 12 brought to life. It was fascinating and interesting"

"Actually getting to use an IR spectroscopy machine was fun to use and helpful getting some examination tips on reading the graphs."

We look forward to welcoming Dr Hoare back in the future.



Year 7 Update


Ms Maxwell, Head of Year 7

Most students in Year 13 wishing to make an application to UCAS have now done so and are receiving multiple offers and appointments to interviews. We are very proud of all of them.

Students in Year 13 looking to make an apprenticeship application have taken part in an interactive Higher and Degree apprentice workshop delivered by the National Apprenticeship Service followed by an assessment day workshop to fully prepare them for the application process. They will be visiting the National Apprenticeship Show at the CBS Arena in January.

Year 12 students are actively engaging in a variety of enrichment opportunities including leading on the Year 7 reading strategy, supporting in Year 10 and 11 lessons, supporting SEND students in the Learning Support Unit and during break times on the Year 7, 8 and 9 playgrounds.
