Duke of Edinburgh Award

Before Christmas, over 70 of our Year 10 students enrolled for the Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award. Ten Year 12 students enrolled for Silver, many having completed Bronze with us while they were in Year 10.

The groups have had a Teams meeting about how to log in to their eDofE accounts and are now busy deciding on their activities for the Volunteering, Physical and Skills sections. Over the next six months, students will upload evidence of what they have completed each week. Some activities need to be adapted to suit government guidelines but there is still plenty to choose from. Our activities so far include:


Similarly, Blooket in French is being used to offer a variety of teaching games to engage students.





Mrs Maxwell, Head of Year 7


Our Year 7 students have done themselves proud...

Year 8 and 9 Update


Mrs Jeremiah, Head of Year 8 and 9


