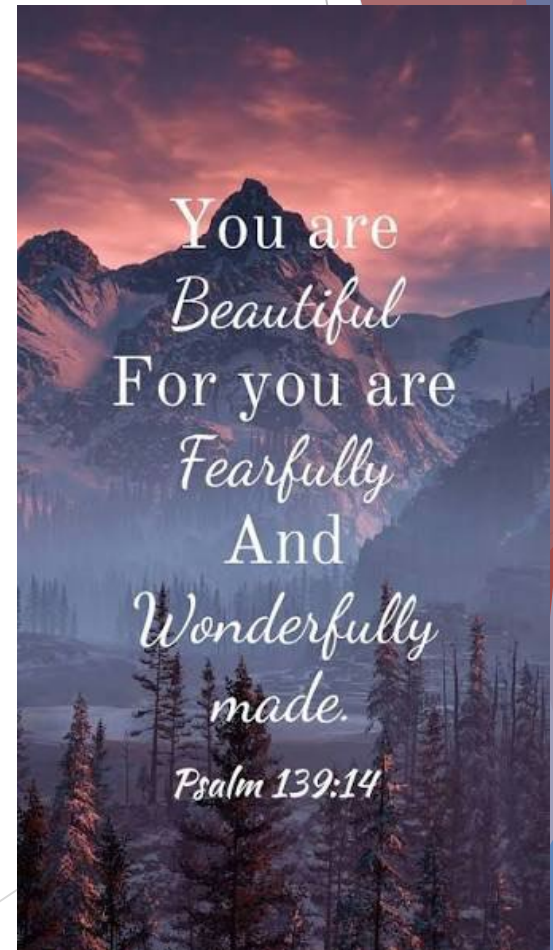

Equipment Check

- A PowerPoint with important student notices for the week.
- In order for lessons to start promptly and allow all students to make the most of their education, they must be Ready. This is one of our school rules. Students must be properly equipped with a well-stocked pencil case. Please support your child all year with this.

WEDNESDAY

Pastoral Check Up (fortnightly)

- Every fortnight, a purple slip is given to each student to complete confidentially whilst the register is being taken. It asks how students are feeling/coping and whether they have any concerns. It offers the opportunity to receive support from Pastoral staff at without having to directly ask and without others being aware.

WEDNESDAY

Character Development -

- **Inspirational People:** This task allows students to hear about other people who do extraordinary things to help others. Hearing about these kind of deeds gives food for thought and inspires students to be the best version of themselves.
- **Character Passport:** This task develops students as a whole person. A variety of tasks for each level are set. Students should aim for a badge per term – Bronze, Silver and Gold. Students work on a variety of tasks like the Reading Award, participation in a club, volunteering to help others and completing some super-curriculum tasks.

‘Thunks’ - Think & discuss

- Each week we look to see how many Ace Points each student has. Behaviour Points must be avoided! The Form group's chances of getting the weekly trophy in assembly relies on every student working together.
- The student with the most Ace Points for the previous week has their name put on the Bee's Knees list. A raffle is then drawn at the end of the half term and a prize is given to the winner.
- A statement is introduced and students then debate this within the form group.

Week B**

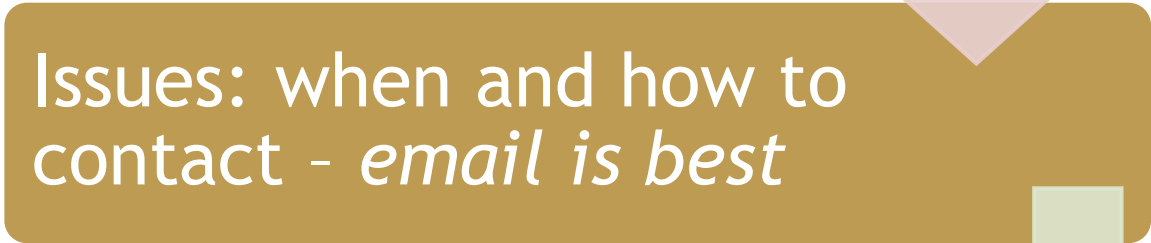

Home Support

How best to support your child with day-to-day expectations:

- ▶ Ensure their bags are packed with their pencil case, their books, their student handbooks and a reading book for each day
- ▶ Check that a copy of their timetable and school map are in their blazer pocket
- ▶ Before leaving in the morning check that uniform is fully correct - see information in handbook
- ▶ Keep their parent pay topped up for school meals as required
- ▶ Remind students about ensuring that their mobile phones are switched off and stored in their bags BEFORE they enter the school site
- ▶ Talk with them about their day. Discuss the highs and any concerns. If needed, encourage your child to speak with us or contact us yourselves if more serious
